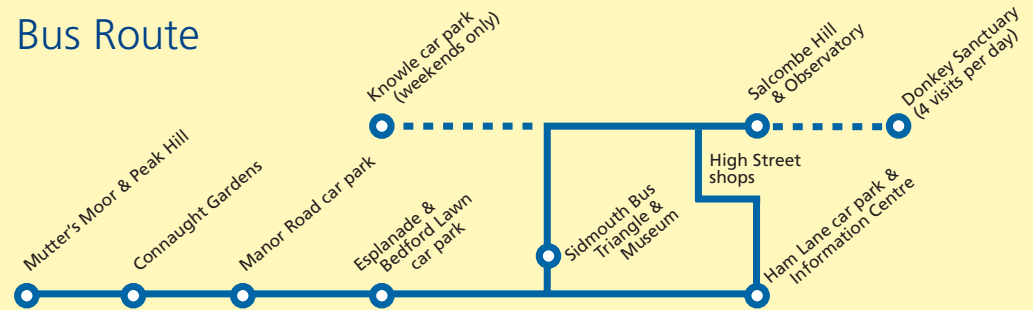

## Sidmouth

Fine shops, bars and restaurants make Sidmouth a **most enjoyable and friendly shopping experience**, with something for everyone.

The many Regency and Victorian buildings give Sidmouth its unique character. Learn more about our rich heritage at the Sidmouth Museum. **Guided Town walks from the Museum start at 11am every Tuesday and Thursdays or 2pm every Wednesday.**

Sidmouth offers a choice of pebble and **family friendly sandy beaches** at Clifton beach or Jacobs Ladder.

The Sidmouth Hopper gives you access to some of the most spectacular sections of England's first natural World Heritage Site – the Jurassic Coast.

**Salcombe Hill, National Trust** **Level easy-access paths** allow all to enjoy the world class views of our coast. For the more active, a 45 minute circular route takes you along the Coast Path to the 'Frog Stone', above Salcombe Regis valley, before returning inland through woodland to the Sidmouth Hopper bus stop. Alternatively walk down the Coast Path enjoying fine views of Sidmouth.

## Norman Lockyer Observatory

This observatory is the **UK's home of astrophysics!** For opening times and events pick up a leaflet from the Hopper bus or Sidmouth Information Centre. The South West Astronomy Fair is on Saturday 6th August.

## The Donkey Sanctuary

Celebrating over 40 years of donkey welfare. Free admission to the farm to see our donkeys and what we do. Enjoy a choice of strolls around the paddocks or down to Weston Mouth.



**Mutter's Moor, Pebblebed Heaths Conservation Trust** **Level paths and tracks** allow you to explore this heathland haven - you'll actually be walking in the footsteps

of a well known local smuggler – Mutter. The heathland is best enjoyed in July and August when the heather is in flower. Great for wildlife, especially basking adders, shy Dartford Warblers or chirring Nightjars at dusk.

## Peak Hill, National Trust

Opposite Mutter's Moor car park, either head straight out to the South West Coast Path or through the National Trust's woodland. You will be rewarded with fabulous views of the Triassic cliffs, the remains of the Iron Age fort on High Peak and the East

Devon AONB. A steep descent along the Coast Path brings you back to Connaught Gardens.

## Connaught Gardens

This **Green Flag award winning garden**, provided by the East Devon District Council offers live music, delightful floral displays, and a restaurant/tea rooms - making this a perfect place to unwind.

## Sidmouth Information Centre



Located by the swimming pool close to the Ham car park, the **helpful staff** can assist with accommodation, travel, advance booking for events and many other queries. There are maps, walking leaflets, books and details of many visitor attractions here.
