

Update to STC Councillors 7th November 2016

1. The Business and Special Interest Groups survey has now closed with 103 responses, some submissions extremely thorough. Tim is starting to do the initial analysis and will report back next week as to how much help he will need with further analysis. I will leave it to Tim to run through further details of both that survey and the initial Residents Survey which you've all had an opportunity to have sight of.

 2. Councillor Cole and Andie Miles, one of the NP team are currently working on the layout and graphics for the Young Persons Surveys, this will go to the printer this week and this Wednesday the young people who had input into the survey have been invited here to STC to finalise all details.

 3. Last week Louise and I met with Julie Tanner from Creating Excellence and worked out a brief that will suit our budget and public consultation requirement to show that we have sought the opinions of a wide group of residents and special interest groups within the Sid Valley, These events are timed to take place midJanuary with the aim of including any substantial feedback received in the 2nd Residents Survey which is now timed to go out by post mid- February..

 4. Currently there is very little change in our spending but we will be spending more of our budget in the New year on consultancy, printing, postage in addition to the public and specially invited guest meeting.

Louise did a massive amount of work on the presentation side of our First Household Survey which looks extremely professional and I think cannot be faulted as our first piece of evidence.
